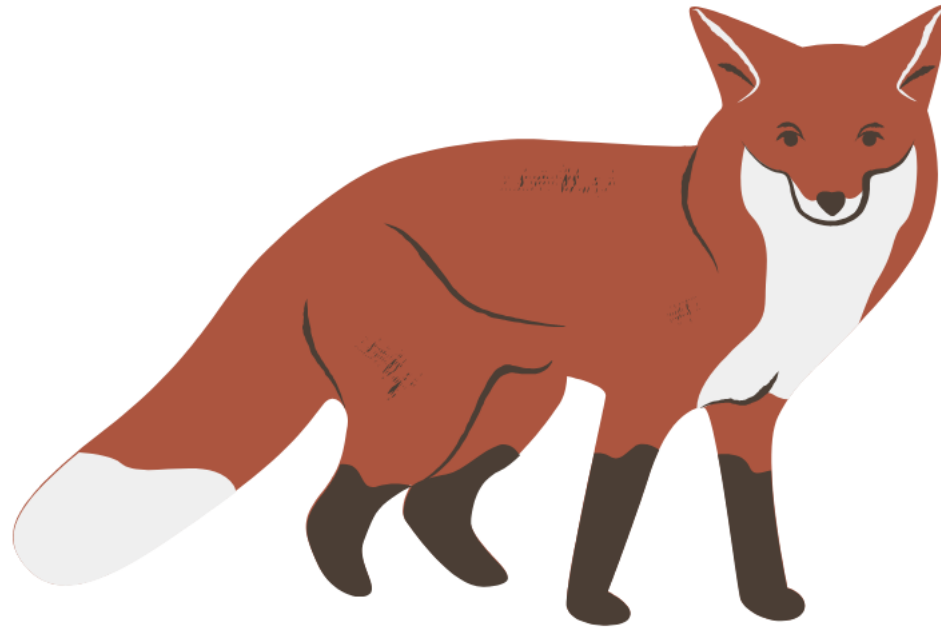

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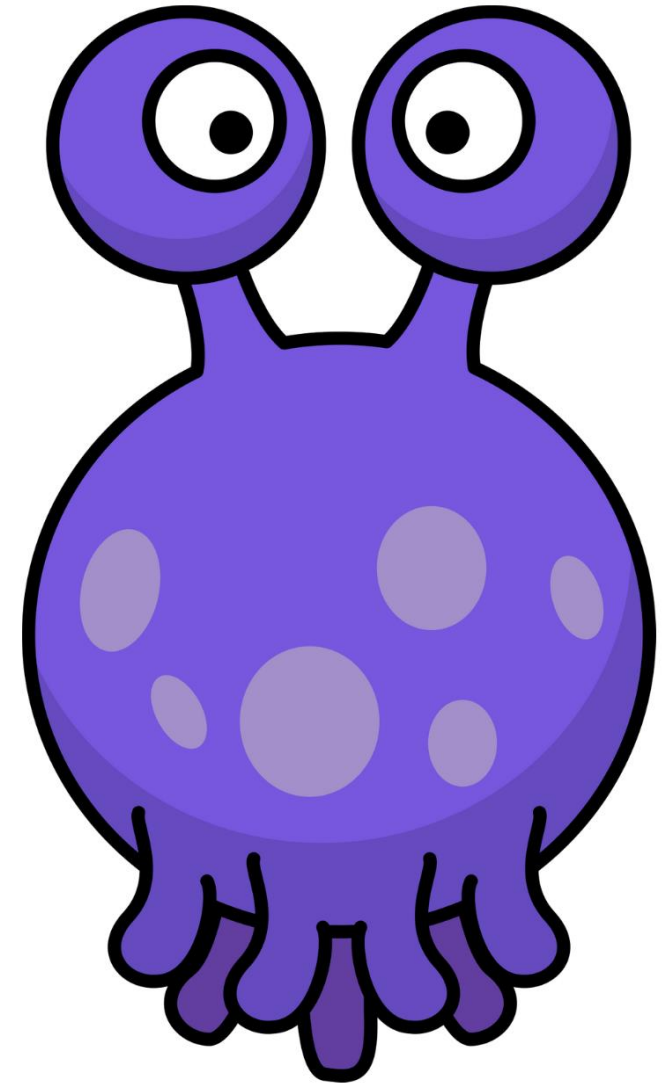
Activity: Relationships with others

What have we already learnt about important relationships in our lives through the poems we've read?

- Relationships change as we grow
- There are different stages in life; we can look back (past) and look forward (future)
- We form impressions and make judgement about others from their appearances- how may these change over time? Can there be different versions of the 'same' person?

Activity: Conversations with an alien

- How would you describe your hometown to the alien?
- Why are people behaving in certain ways? (I.e., talking on the phone, sitting at a coffee house, waiting in line.)
- What would the alien need to know?
- How would you make the alien feel welcome?





Activity – My special object

- Think of an object that feels special to you. It might be a family heirloom, a gift from a loved one, a symbol (i.e. national flag) or something that you do in your everyday life.
- You may like to consider: How does it relate to you? Why is this object important? What does it reveal about yourself?
